Description: Youth Ocean delegates will visit the Sea Turtle Rescue Center, which annually accommodates approximately 70 injured or sick sea turtles rescued along Greek shores and seas. The center provides medical care and rehabilitation for the turtles, facilitating their return to the sea. The operation and maintenance of the Sea Turtle Rescue Center rely on specialized permanent staff, volunteers from the Attica region, and volunteers from around the world.


From Coastal to Forest Cleanup
